Ann Jackson Gallery: Dackgrounder

Ann Jackson Gallery is a family owned and operated art gallery located on Canton Street in Historic Roswell, GA. The gallery has been in business since 1971. Ann Jackson Gallery carries various artists' artworks from various locals, regions, and nations.

One special niche about Ann Jackson Gallery is that the gallery is one of a select few art galleries licensed to sell and carry the Art of Dr. Seuss. Ann Jackson Gallery also provides consulting and services for artwork as well.



Local to international artists work at the gallery:

The gallery sells artwork from artists that com from various places. These artists include local artists in the Atlanta area, artists from the southeast United States and other regions of the United States, to international artists.

These artists' works, that the gallery carries, are in various mediums ranging from oils, acrylics, works on paper, sculpture, and glass. Ann Jackson Gallery prides itself on having the finest artwork available for their clientele.

The gallery and Dr. Seuss:

The gallery's special niche is that it is one of 30 art galleries in the world, and one of 15 in the United States; licensed to sell and carry the Art of Dr. Seuss (Theodore Geisel).

The gallery often has Dr. Seuss art shows. These art shows often showcase Dr. Seuss' artwork by itself or have people who do artwork in the style of Dr. Seuss as a tribute.



One such show included the premier of the Bronze Sculpture Tribute Collection in 2006. This show had bronze sculptures created by artist Leo Rijn as a tribute to the characters of Dr. Seuss.

2007 saw the special celebration for the 50th Anniversary of the "The Cat in the Hat." This featured a life size drawing of the cat known as "Ted's Cat," named after Theodore Geisel (Dr. Seuss), which hung in Geisel's studio in California. The galley had special readings from "The Cat in the Hat" and a proclamation which was made by Jere Wood, the Mayor of Roswell, during the event.



In 2008, the gallery had a Dr. Seuss for President Exhibit. It featured Theodore Geisel's illustrations that he did during World War II for Judge Magazine and PM Magazine. The exhibit also had more political children's stories that Theodore Geisel wrote as Dr. Seuss.

This included Horton Hears a Who, The Lorax, The Butter Battle Book, and Yertle the Turtle.



In 2010, part of the gallery's Dr. Seuss collection was used at the Breman Jewish Museum for their exhibit of "Dr. Seuss Goes to War...and More!"

Every year the gallery has an annual Dr. Seuss Holiday Show which is usually on the first weekend of December.

In 2011, it was on December 10 and 11. This show was called "Grinchmas Returns."

Ann Jackson Gallery services and framing:

Finally, the gallery also provides services and framing. The gallery has developed a relationship with hundreds of artists to insure that their clientele's needs are met for both home and office art purchases and framing.

The gallery provides in-house art consultation for assessment, recommendations, planning, and budgeting to see that the desired art is acquired for their client's needs. The work that the gallery gets for their clients are original paintings, limited edition prints, photographs, sculptures, glass, and other works of art. Once the art is acquired, the gallery will custom frame, light, deliver, and install the artwork.
